

4 Ways to Use the College & Career Planning Dashboard

The **College and Career Planning Dashboard**, available through your Encourage Educator Reports, summarizes key information about your connected students' future goals and interests.

<h3>Tip 1</h3> <h4>Identify Knowledge Gaps</h4> <p>If your dashboard shows only a few students interested in trade schools, private colleges, or special mission institutions, this may signal a knowledge gap.</p> <p>Help students explore more possibilities by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Inviting guest speakers in • Organizing college visits or virtual tours • Including these pathways in classroom lessons <p>Low engagement may also indicate that staff members need more exposure. Contact college reps for materials or training, especially for options outside your local area.</p>	<h3>Tip 2</h3> <h4>Target College Fair Attendees</h4> <p>The Declared Colleges tab lets you see which schools your students are most interested in. Use this data to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Prioritize which colleges to invite to your fairs • Ensure strong representation that reflects student interests • Share insights with admissions reps - If they see they're a top 10 destination, it may influence their decision to attend the fair. <p>Tracking trends over time also helps demonstrate growing student interest, especially if you're building relationships with new college partners.</p>
<h3>Tip 3</h3> <h4>Shape Career Education</h4> <p>Use career interest data from the dashboard to guide your CTE and career readiness efforts.</p> <p>This insight can help you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Choose CTE courses that match student goals • Invite speakers for career events • Identify gaps in awareness of local job opportunities <p>Connecting student interests with real workforce needs ensures your programs are both engaging and impactful.</p>	<h3>Tip 4</h3> <h4>Determine Need</h4> <p>Use filters to see which student groups are exploring two-year, four-year, public, and private colleges or the military.</p> <p>Look for patterns by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gender • First-gen status • Race or ethnicity <p>Filtering helps uncover opportunity gaps and guides targeted outreach, tailored support programs, and stronger grant applications.</p>
