WARNING SIGNS:
Has no local business address or only provides a cell phone number
Has no local business address or only provides a cell phone number
Requests full payment upfront before work begins
Refuses to provide a detailed written estimate
Cannot show proper licensing or insurance documentation
Uses high-pressure sales tactics or demands immediate decisions
Offers bids significantly lower than other competitors
Claims to have "leftover materials" from another job
Solicits door-to-door after storms or extreme weather
Offers "free" inspections and immediately finds urgent problems
BEFORE YOU HIRE:
☐ Check state licensing database
Request Certificate of Insurance
☐ Verify Better Business Bureau rating
Confirm business registration with your Secretary of State
Ask for local references from recent projects
☐ Test their expertise with specific questions about your project type

F YOU SUSPECT FRAUD, ACT QUICKLY:
Document everything: contracts, receipts, photos, communications
Contact your bank/credit card company to dispute charges
File a police report with local law enforcement
Report to state consumer protection agencies
File a complaint with the Better Business Bureau
Notify your homeowners insurance company
Consider consulting with legal counsel for significant losses

ADDITIONAL PROTECTION STRATEGIES: Get multiple quotes for any major work Never sign contracts under pressure Research contractors online beyond their own website Ask neighbors for recommendations and experiences Start with small projects to test a contractor's reliability Keep detailed records of all home improvement work Know your insurance coverage

Remember: Legitimate contractors welcome questions and verification. If someone pressures you to skip these steps, that's your biggest red flag of all.
