

NORTHWEST AURORA

Spanning several decades of negotiations, we take an in-depth look at the complex interplay of water rights, tribal sovereignty, and environmental stewardship in the arid West.

This episode reveals the remarkable transformation of the Rocky Mountain Arsenal from a chemical site to a thriving sanctuary for wildlife. The arsenal's history reflects changing ideals and priorities for Americans throughout the 20th century. Now more than 330 species of animals including bison, bald eagles and black-footed ferrets call the Rocky Mountain Arsenal National Wildlife Refuge home.

The Rising Road: FDR brings the same optimism and energy to the White House that his cousin Theodore displayed. Aimed at ending the Depression, his sweeping New Deal restores the people's self-confidence and transforms the relationship between them and their government. Eleanor rejects the traditional role of first lady, becomes her husband's liberal conscience and a sometimes controversial political force.

FRI Sep 12 | 8 PM




AMERICA'S SOCIAL ARCHITECT




