WHERE TO STAY

New: L7 Chicago by Lotte A century-old building got a new lease on life last year with the opening of this hotel, the South Korean brand's first in North America. Colour and creativity drive the interior design - guilted headboards and block-patterned carpeting add texture to rooms while sculptural lighting and cheery art deliver whimsy. Classic: The Peninsula Chicago

The Peninsula is deserving of every accolade it's received. Service is excellent and the guest rooms are serene and among the largest in the city. WHERE TO EAT

New: Maxwells Trading This resto was designed by WDA Design Group and Meg McMorrow Design in a modern industrial style — think exposed brick, clean-lined furniture and vintage lighting. The menu is an appealing blend of Japanese, Chinese and Thai cuisines. Chicago Architecture Center Walking Tours Whether you're fascinated by Art Deco skyscrapers, the L,



iconic stores or new buildings, a walking tour is a great place for getting Chicago's design story. Tours run 90 minutes to two hours and offer historical and cultural insight, along with lots of architectural info. Multiple locations, architecture.org/city-tours Frank Lloyd Wright Home and Studio Tour Visit Frank's first home and studio, where the icon developed his renowned Prairie style architecture. The Inside and Out tour guides you through the storied interiors, then walks you around the grounds and neighbourhood to see other FLW-designed homes. 951 Chicago Ave., Oak Park, Ill., flwright.org Art Institute of Chicago In a city rich in culture,

this museum is the best of the best. The circa-1893 building, with architecture by George Foster Shepley and recent expansions by Renzo Piano, is one of the oldest and largest museums in the U.S. The collection is more than 300,000 pieces strong, ranging from Chinese bronzes to modern textiles. Until the end of March, catch Project a Black Planet: The Art and Culture of Panafrica, an exhibition that conveys the aspirations and ideas of the continent. 111 South Michigan Ave., artic.edu

WHERE TO SHOP

Anecdote, just 30 minutes west of the city in La Grange, is the perfect place for refined, minimalist furniture and other finds.
