Our mental health team is committed to offering services that are systemic, trauma-informed, and include brain and strengths-based perspectives. Services are offered on a sliding scale and no family is ever turned away for an inability to pay. Momentous Institute offers a truly dynamic work environment where therapy can unfold in collaboration with the family, without the need to bill or justify services to insurance companies.

Role: Psychologist who will provide direct services to children, adolescents, and families as well as supervision and training to doctoral psychology interns as part an [APA-Accredited Internship Program](#).

Responsibilities:

- Provide assessment, psychotherapy (individual, family, and/or group) and consulting services to children, adolescents, and families in a multidisciplinary outpatient setting. Momentous Institute is committed to diversifying the way psychological services are provided. Therefore, some clinical interventions may be provided in the community in collaboration with organization partners
- Supervise the clinical and administrative work of psychology trainees, including supervision of both therapy and assessment
- Attend planning and training meetings to contribute to the implementation and development of training programs at Momentous Institute
- Collaborate with training committee members and Momentous Institute staff as needed to support the development of trainees
- Provide trainings (in the community and internally) on topics relevant to the field of child/family psychology
- Work in collaboration with Momentous School to support the needs of referred students, their families, and teachers.
- Participate in program evaluation efforts within the organization
- Maintain all paperwork requirements for both clinical and supervision services

Qualifications:

- Psychologist licensed in Texas.
 - **Licensed eligible psychologists who have earned a doctorate in psychology and completed an APA-accredited internship will be considered.** If hired, licensure as a psychologist must be obtained within 1 year. If a candidate has not completed the required year of postdoctoral experience, Momentous Institute will structure the first year of employment to meet this requirement as defined by the state licensing board. (salary will be adjusted for licensed eligible candidates)
- Minimum of three years of experience providing therapy

- Preference for psychologists who have provided supervision to graduate trainees
- Able to work with clients/colleagues of diverse backgrounds including ethnicity, socioeconomic status, gender, religion, etc.
- Experience assessing learning disabilities as well as social emotional functioning of children and adolescents is required. Experience assessing bi-lingual (English & Spanish) children preferred
- Capacity to provide services at least two evenings a week
- Theoretical orientation that is strength based and trauma informed
- Strategic thinker that supports program development
- Team oriented mindset
- Excellent communication skills – verbal and written
- Excellent interpersonal skills
- Ability to receive feedback and open to self-reflection

Physical Requirements:

- Occasionally moving self in different positions to accomplish tasks in various environments including tight and confined spaces.
- Constantly remaining in a stationary position, often standing, or sitting for prolonged periods.
- Occasionally adjusting or moving objects up to 15 pounds in all directions
- Occasionally operating motor vehicles
