

Bilingual Clinical Group Therapist (Bilingual English/Spanish required)

Reports to: Director of Group Programming

Position Status: Full- Time Exempt

Therefore, we offer services in both English and Spanish on a sliding scale, ensuring that no family is turned away due to financial constraints.

Role:

The Clinical Group Therapist works with a team of licensed mental health professionals in a structured group program (*Huddle Up*) which is an experiential, multi-family, therapeutic program for pre-teens and teens (ages 11-15) and their families presenting with mental health concerns. In addition to group therapy, this clinician will also provide family and individual therapy services as well as case management. Services are provided on site at Momentous Institute, as well as in community settings such as local schools. This program also contains a nature-based component which involves overnight (2 weekends per year) trips to our nature-based therapeutic campsite in East Texas. This role may also provide additional group therapy interventions identified as a need, based upon presenting client concerns.

Responsibilities:

- Work as part of a multidisciplinary team including psychologists, social workers, and clinicians to ensure continuity and quality of care and services
- Complete intake screenings for potential clients referred to the Huddle-Up program
- Attend all Huddle Up Nature-based overnight camping trips
- Provide after school and evening programming for individuals, families, and groups
- Provide group therapy to participants in Huddle Up programming at Momentous Institute and in the community
- Provide individual and/or family therapy to participants in Huddle-Up program, as well as clients seeking support through Mental Health Services as needed
- Provide casework to families participating in Huddle Up, including phone calls, parent consultations, referrals, and coordination of care
- Maintain and organize electronic clinical charts with current treatment plans, progress notes and other necessary documentation
- Provide consultation as needed to educators and other caregivers involved in clients' care
- Participate in program evaluation efforts within the organization
- Adhere to the legal and ethical requirements of the profession and the organization
- Perform other duties as assigned by Director of Group Programming

Qualifications:

- Texas licensed therapist; or licensed eligible (LPC, LCSW, LMFT)
- ***Fluency in both Spanish and English required.***
- A minimum of three years' experience working with children and families

- A minimum of three years' experience providing group therapy with youth
- Capacity to provide services at least two evenings a week (one evening being Tuesday)
- Strong working knowledge of child development and group therapy interventions/treatment approaches.
- Theoretical orientation that is strength based, and trauma informed
- Strategic thinker that supports program development
- Team oriented mindset
- Excellent communication skills – verbal and written
- Excellent interpersonal skills
- Ability to receive feedback and open to self-reflection
- Ability to work with clients and colleagues of diverse ethnic and socioeconomic backgrounds.

Physical Demands:

- Occasionally moving self in different positions to accomplish tasks in various environments including tight and confined spaces.
- Constantly remaining in a stationary position, often standing, or sitting for prolonged periods.
- Occasionally adjusting or moving objects up to 15 pounds in all directions
- Occasionally operating motor vehicles
